100 Manitoba Guiding Facts

Below are 100 facts about the History of Guiding in Manitoba. Use these facts to create a timeline with your unit or simply read for your own information, you are bound to discover something new and find a new respect for the contribution of Guiding in our Province. 1910's

- 1910 – The Manitoba Council of Girl Guides of Canada was founded
- 1911 – Manitoba was the first province to develop First Aid into their program, incorporating St. John's Ambulance techniques
- 1914 – The 1st Brandon Company was formed
- 1915 – The 1st Winnipeg Company was formed in October by Mrs. F.A. McMillan
- 1916 – Lady Aikins became the first of 19 Manitoba Provincial Commissioners
- 1916 – The 1st Brandon Company held the Company's first camp in Lake Clements
- 1918 – Spanish Flu outbreak put restrictions on Guiding, as no public meetings were allowed to take place
- 1919 – Lady Baden Powell visited Winnipeg for the first time

1920's

- 1920's – The first Ranger unit met at St. Luke's Anglican Church
- 1920's – Brownies wore wide brimmed straw hats as part of their uniform (the uniform changed in 1930)
- 1921 – The 1st Winnipeg Brownie Pack was formed
- 1921 – Guiding arrived in the Fort Rouge area, with the formation of two companies at St. Luke's and St. George's Anglican.
- 1923 – Lady Baden Powell visited Winnipeg for the second time
- 1923 – The 24th Winnipeg Guide Company was formed at Crescent Fort Rouge Church
- 1923 – The 23rd Winnipeg Guide Company formed at St. John's Cathedral
- 1924 – The 2nd Winnipeg Brownie Pack was formed in Sturgeon Creek Church
- 1924 – A Rally of 20 units took place on the grounds of Government house, in which 500 Guides and Guiders were saluted by Sir James Aikins.
- 1926 – The 7th Rangers company put on a short play at the Shriners' Hospital
- 1927 – The 1st Neepawa Company registered on December 5th with 32 girls
- 1927 – Mrs. R.M. Denniston became the 2nd Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1927 – Winnipeg Guiders heard stories of the first Guides selling homemade cookies as a fundraiser in Regina.
- 1927 – 800 Brownies, Guides and Rangers were reviewed by Lady Wellington at the Hudson Bay Company Store.
- 1927 – The 48th Brownie Pack registered with 50-60 girls enrolled that year
- 1928 – The first permanent Guide camp was established at Ponemah Beach on Lake Winnipeg
- 1928 – Two Gimli Girl Guides were recommended for Life Saving Medals after rescuing two young boys from drowning in Gimli Harbour. They received the Girl Guides Canadian Council Silver Cross
- 1928 – Guides started Christmas toy collection of toys to be repaired and distributed to Children of British Settlers.
- 1929 – The 21st St. Albans Guide company sold 'Guide stickers' to fundraise for food and toys for a poor family in Norwood

1930's

- 1930 – Mrs. J Bracken became the 3rd Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1931 – A Grand Rally took place on May 29th. Activities included the Red River Jig, Home Nursing and Signalling Drill
- 1931 – Manitoba's Provincial Camp at Ponemah Beach held the first Dominion meeting for the Girl Guide Association, the first meeting where all provinces were represented
- 1931 – At the above camp, 903 Guides participated in forming the "Human Flag", a recreation of the Union Jack by Guides from all over Winnipeg
- 1931 – Winnipeg Guiders took over the operation the "The Bay" Downtown for one Saturday, working as clerks, supervisors, etc. Half of the profits from the day were donated to Girl Guides
- 1933 – Lady Baden Powell returned to Winnipeg for the third time
- 1935 – Lady Baden Powell returned to Winnipeg for the second time in two years, making this her fourth visit to Winnipeg

- 1935 – The 1st Stony Mountain Brownie Pack registered with 18 girls
- 1935 – Her Excellency, the Countess of Bessborough, donated the Bessborough Shield to each province. Manitoba decided to encourage the study of nature as the theme for the challenge and competition for the shield took place. The shield was retired to the 1st Virden Company in 1975, as they had won it three times
- 1935 – A church parade was held for Scouts and Guides in Fort Rouge. This parade was the first in which there were more Guides than Scouts
- 1938 – Mrs. J.R. Murray became the 4th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1938 – Winnipeg Girl Guides took part in Mosquito Tag Day
- 1939 – King George VI and the Queen visited Winnipeg and attended a Guiding Rally

1940's

- 1940 – Canadian Guides raised money for two air ambulances and a motor lifeboat called the "Guide of Dunkirk", used in the evacuation of France during WWII
- 1940 – The Girl Guide canteen opened in the Civic Auditorium in Winnipeg where tea was served to Red Cross Workers
- 1943 – Mrs. G.E. Semmens became the 5th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1944 – The 1st Stony Mountain Company was recorded for their accomplishments in the war efforts, including volunteering at Red Cross Functions
- 1944 – Flin Flon Guides were reported making Canadian Friendship books for liberated Europeans full of pictures depicting Canada for children who could not read
- 1945 – The original Guide House at 50 Osborne Street was dedicated to Guiding and cost \$10,000 to purchase
- 1946 – Lady Baden Powell attended a Rally in Winnipeg, making her fifth trip to Winnipeg
- 1946 – Girl Guides were interviewed several times on the radio station CKRC
- 1947 – The 84th Guide Company started in Rivercrest in the basement of a former English Guider, Mrs. Mary Holland
- 1949 – The second permanent Guide Camp was established at Caddy Lake and opened July 11
- 1949 – Mrs. R.F.T. Greer became the 6th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1949 – Guide and Brownie units presented education kits to the "Save Our Children Fund" to be forwarded to Europe

1950's

- 1950 – During the Great Flood, Girl Guides of all ages helped at the evacuation headquarters at the Civic Auditorium (now the Provincial Archives Building) working as runners, helping with children, helping in the canteen, sorting clothing and cleaning bathrooms
- 1951 – Gene Autry visited Brandon and donated 50 tickets to Guides and Brownies to see his show
- 1951 – The 52nd Brownie pack was registered. They planted golden tulips and when they bloomed, took them to 'shut ins' to brighten their day
- 1951 - 150 Girl Guides met to compete in the largest gathering of the Girl Guide Swimming club at the YMCA
- 1952 – Lady Baden Powell visited Winnipeg for the sixth time, attending a Rally at the Playhouse Theatre
- 1952 – The 67th Pack formed at the Kildonan Baptist Church
- 1953 – Joyce Douglas of Flin Flon, then 19 years old, was chosen to represent the Commonwealth at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II
- 1954 – Mrs. W.J. Riley became the 7th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1955 – A large Rally was held for a visit by Lady Baden Powell, in which 1200 Brownies and 2200 Guides attended
- 1955 – At the above Rally, 576 Brownies joined to form a human Maple Leaf Flag
- 1958 – Mrs. G.W. Mallaher became the 8th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1959 – Over 800 Brownies formed a human bouquet of Tulips at the Rally for the 50th Anniversary of Guiding in Canada
- 1959 – Over 4000 Guiding Members and 6000 spectators joined in the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of Guiding
- 1959 – The 131st Company was formed in Middlechurch
- 1959 – The HMCS Chippewa helped Sea Rangers learn about plotting a course and using Sonar detection equipment

1960's

- 1960 – The 128th Company of St. Joseph's Church formed
- 1962 – Our New National Office opened at 50 Merton Street in Toronto. Manitoba Girl Guides participated in a "Inches for Sale" Fundraising Campaign in which \$0.10 bought 1 square inch of the National office. In total we contributed \$801.10 to this campaign, resulting in the ownership of 8,011 square inches.
- 1963 – Mrs. J.M Headlam became the 9th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1963 – The Chief Commissioner of Canada, Miss E. H. Osler of Toronto, visited Northern Manitoba Guides in Flin Flon.
- 1965 – Christie Brown Co. made our cookies, one row chocolate and one row vanilla, selling for \$0.50 a box
- 1965 – The 9th Land Ranger Company registered
- 1967 – 48 Girls attended the Provincial Brownie Pack Holiday Camp to celebrate the 100th Birthday of Canada. Cost for camp was a whopping \$12.00 per girl
- 1969 – Miss Catherine A. Peer became the 10th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner

1970's

- 1970—The Girl Guide office at 50 Osborne Street was appropriated by the City of Winnipeg to make way for high-rise buildings. Girl Guides proceeded to open new offices on Edmonton Street.
- 1974 – Mrs. N.A. Winograd became the 11th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1977 – (Dr.) Mrs. M.E. Bayer became the 12th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1978 – His Royal Highness Prince Phillip chatted with Girl Guides as he presented them their Duke of Edinburgh awards.
- 1979 – Lisa Kaufmann received the Girl Guide of Canada Silver Cross for rescuing 4 children from a burning house
- 1979 – The first Pathfinder units opened in Manitoba

1980's

- 1980 – Mrs. K.W. Clark became the 13th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1980 – Lady Price, the chairman of WAGGGS, was in Winnipeg and was entertained by Guides singing at a campfire while filling the foyer of the Legislature buildings
- 1983—The Girl Guide office closed on Edmonton Street and moved to a new location on St. James Street.
- 1984 – His Royal Highness Prince Phillip visited Thompson and personally awarded 17 youth members their Duke of Edinburgh awards
- 1985 – Mrs. Evelyn A. Williams became the 14th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1985 – The Northwest Clothing Project was done to assist 11 new units in the Central and Eastern Arctic attain much needed uniforms. Donations were accepted across the province
- 1985 – Girl Guide Rose bushes, a special golden variegated rose bush developed specially for our 75th Anniversary, were purchased and planted
- 1987 – Provincial Pathfinders enjoyed a Paddlewheel Queen Boat Sleepover which included over 100 participants
- 1988 – The first Spark Units opened in Manitoba
- 1989 – Patricia R. Hawkeye became the 15th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner

1990's

- 1994 – Marjorie Gerrard became the 16th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 1999 – Manitoba hosted one of the four sites for Canadian Mosaic at St.Malo Provincial Park. The play structure in the park was donated by Manitoba Guides.
- 1999 – Carol J. Anderson became the 17th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner

2000's

- 2002—His Royal Highness, Prince Phillip, presented Gold Duke of Edinburgh Awards to over a dozen Manitoba Girl Guides
- 2003 – Girl Guides collected over 250 books as part of a "Kids Helping Kids" book drive campaign
- 2003 - The Girl Guide Store and Provincial Office moved to its current location at #213-530 Century Street
- 2004 – Michelle J. Barclay became the 18th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 2009 – Debra Halligan became the 19th Manitoba Provincial Commissioner
- 2009 – The Caddy Lake Girl Guide camp celebrated its 60th Anniversary



Manitoba Guiding On Display

Winnipeg Millennium Library

This fun exhibit in the children's department of the Millennium Library will focus on the girls experience throughout the 100 years of our amazing history. Bookmarks and stickers will be available at the library. The exhibit will also feature an interactive game for girls.

When: January - June 2010
Where: Units across Canada (and around the world!)
What: A unique chance to discover more about our Guiding sisters worldwide
Who: Girl Members across Canada

You're one in 10 million! As a Member of Girl Guides of Canada, you are one of 10 million Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from 145 countries. With the 100 in 100 Challenge, you'll have the chance to learn more about your Guiding sisters around the world. This online, interactive Challenge encourages girls to virtually visit 100 countries within the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS). Every week between January and June 2010, we'll be adding new countries to the interactive Challenge map.

How to participate:

- Starting in January 2010, visit the 100 in 100 interactive map to learn more about your Guiding sisters around the world.
- Ideally, Units will learn about at least 25 countries throughout the year (or three per girl). Challenge yourself to explore countries from all five of the WAGGGS regions.

This challenge can be done individually or as a Unit.

Eradicate Hunger and Poverty Service Project

When: January - December 2010

Where: Units across Canada

What: A global awareness project to help Members take action on hunger and poverty.

Who: Girl and adult Members across Canada

The Eradicate Hunger and Poverty 2010 National Service Project is a unique way for girls to learn about hunger and poverty in their community, across Canada and around the world. The toolkit and documents online at <http://2010.girlguides.ca> will help your Unit plan a project to take action against hunger where you live.

We're challenging all Units to donate at least 50 kilograms (approximately 110 pounds) to a local food bank. That means if all Units participate, we could possibly donate more than 300,000 kilograms of food! To help everyone reach their goal, we will be keeping an online tally on the website throughout 2010. Each Unit will be able to log in and track their progress.

This global awareness service project follows the UN Millennium Development Goals adopted by the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS). As we celebrate our 100th anniversary in 2010, the Eradicate Hunger and Poverty National Service Project offers girls an unprecedented opportunity to speak out and take action on hunger and poverty in their communities.

How to participate:

- Read the Canada Story in *The Right to Food* comic book with the girls in your Unit
- Learn about hunger and poverty issues where you live
- Plan and carry out your project(s) against hunger
- Think globally and read one or more other stories from *The Right to Food* comic book
- Log your totals on the national tally calculator (available in January 2010)

Note: This service project will take several meetings.

Who: Everyone!

Cost per Participant: \$10.00 per person includes a full day of exciting activities, 100th Anniversary Birthday cake and a special crest.

What: National Rally Day is a chance to shine the spotlight on Guiding. For girls and Guiders the rally will be a time to celebrate 100 great years of Canadian Guiding! Come celebrate with us at one of the Manitoba locations, each holding their own unique festivities, described more below. Come be part of Manitoba's Guiding History!

To help us plan better and meet your needs, please fill in the Preliminary Rally Registration sheet found at the back of this guide on page 16 and send it to the Provincial office by February 28, 2010. Please note that this is just to help us estimate attendance, does not require payment and will not count as an actual registration. The official Rally Registration Form will be available at a later date and posted on the Provincial website and sent out through the Provincial Council publication 'The Buffalo'. Accommodation in Winnipeg for units who may require them, may be available if indicated on Preliminary Rally Registration sheet.

Description: The National Rally in Winnipeg festivities will consist of a series of round robin activities, organized by branch, which will include activities such as crafts, heritage themed activities, being active activities, nature based activities and a service project.



Guiding Mosaic 2010

When: July 8-17, 2010

Where: Guelph Lake Conservation District, Guelph, Ontario

Who: If you were born between 1992-1998 and are a Pathfinder, Ranger and/or Trex, or are an enthusiastic Guider, you can participate in Guiding Mosaic 2010. Check out below for more details and visit www.guidingmosaic.com.

What: The experience of a lifetime! Come and join an anticipated 1000 members of Guiding from Canada and the World!

Girl Participant—If you were born between 1995-1998, you will travel as a girl participant. You will travel and camp with girls in Patrols of 8-10 girls and 2+ leaders. When you register you have the option to register in a patrol you already know or be placed in a group which has space for you. After you have registered you will have access to the Activity catalogue in which you can register to experience a wide range of activities of your choice ranging from adventure activities, sports, technology, science and out-trips to area attractions such as Niagara Falls. In Manitoba, a special camp is planned in the spring of 2010 to practice camp skills and meet with everyone going from Manitoba.

Ranger or Trex Participant—if you are 15-18 years of age in 2010 you will be able to participate in a fantastic and exciting program of your choice, designed especially for you, while having the opportunity for personal growth and enhancement of your leadership skills.

Patrol Leader/Assistant Patrol Leader— if you are the age of majority, with a valid police record check, you are able to work with your team and a Patrol of 8-10 girls to ensure that the camp experience is the best it can be for everyone. You will also get to enjoy special programs designed just for you, after you register you will have access to a special activity catalogue full of exciting opportunities to learn and explore.

Core Crew— if you are the age of majority, with a valid police record check, you can volunteer as a part of the core crew. This is a great way to challenge yourself while contributing in all aspects of camp with an incredible team to ensure the camp is a special and unique experience for everyone.

How to Register: As a Girl or Adult participant you may register as an individual or as a Patrol. If you are registering as a Patrol Guider/Assistant Patrol Guider, you will be assigned a Registration # and be given the opportunity to list the girls you are going to have in your Patrol, you can change or update this information. Give that Registration # to your girls and they will automatically be attached to the Patrol once they register. If you register as an individual and later connect to a Patrol the same process will work in reverse. Go to www.guidingmosaic.com for more details. The registration and first payment is due NO LATER THEN February 28, 2010.

Cost: The cost of registration has been broken down into three payments. The first and second payment is due no later than February 28, 2010 and the final payment is due no later than March 31, 2010. The total costs for members are laid out below. The Manitoba Council is subsidizing the cost of participants from Manitoba, as seen in brackets beside the sections. Contact your district and area commissioners about further subsidies that may be available.

Girl Participant—Total \$945.00 plus cost of transportation (*\$500 subsidy from Manitoba Council*)

Patrol Guider—Total of \$945.00 plus cost of transportation (*\$500 subsidy from Manitoba Council*)

Ranger/Trex—Total of \$472.50 plus cost of transportation (*\$300 subsidy from Manitoba Council*)

Core Crew—Total of \$472.50 cost of domestic transportation covered (*\$200 subsidy from Manitoba Council*)
