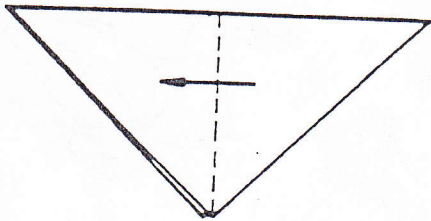
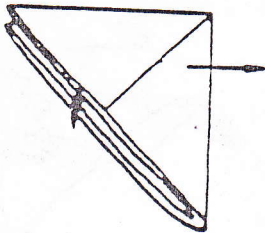


Make an Origami Peace Crane (G,P,SrB,A)

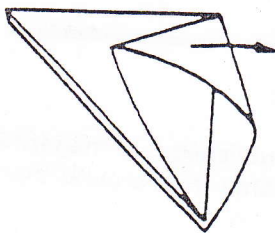
1. Fold a square piece of paper into a triangle.



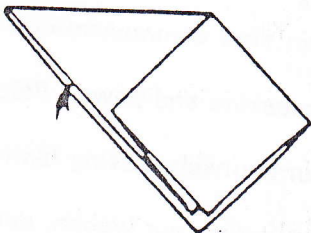
2. Fold the triangle in half.



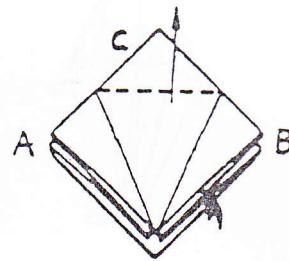
3. Open top layer and fold down into a square.



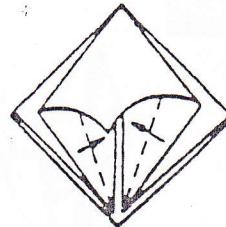
4. Turn over and do the same on the other side.



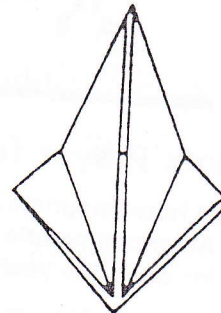
5. At A, fold top layer to centre fold so there is a point at the bottom. Do the same on the other side. Then fold down C.



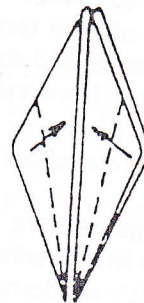
6. Open up all flaps. Lift top layer from the bottom.



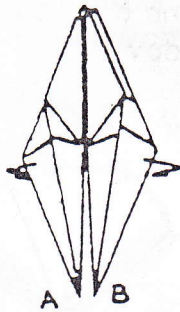
7. Fold into diamond shape on both sides.



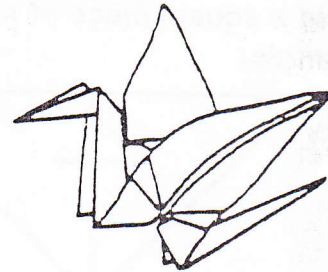
8. Fold each flap to centre fold.



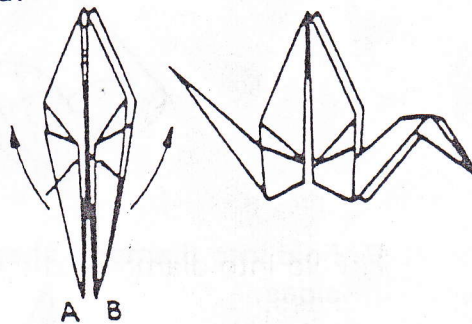
9. Repeat on the other side.



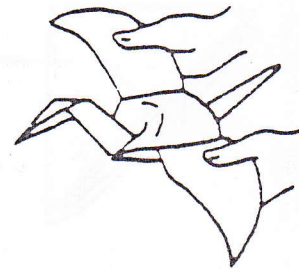
11. Carefully pull wings open to the side and press down on the body.



10. Fold A up to the middle. Fold one end of the neck inwards to make the head.



12. Curve the wings.



One Man's Prayer for Peace

International hotel magnate, Conrad Hilton, wrote this prayer and published it in magazines as his gift to the American people on July 4, 1952. Requests for copies came from around the world and continued for over five years.

[God], we pray that You save us from ourselves.

The world that You have made for us, to live in peace, we have made into an armed camp. We live in fear of war to come.

We are afraid of "the terror that flies by night and the arrow that flies by day, the pestilence that walks in darkness and the destruction that wastes at noon-day."

We have turned from You to go our selfish way. We have broken Your commandments and denied Your truth.

We have left Your altars to serve the false gods of money and pleasure and power. Forgive us and help us.

Now, darkness gathers around us and we are confused in all our counsels. Losing faith with You, we lose faith in our selves.

Inspire us with wisdom, all of us, of every color, race and creed, to use our wealth, our strength, to help our brother[s and sisters], instead of destroying [them].

Help us to do Your will as it is done in Heaven and to be worthy of Your promise of peace on earth. Fill us with new faith, new strength, and new courage, that we may win the battle for peace.
