

## How do I make a Remembrance Day wreath? (Sparks and Brownies)

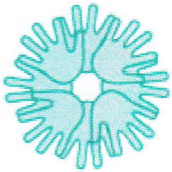
Materials needed:

1. Green, red and black construction paper
2. Glue
3. Scissors



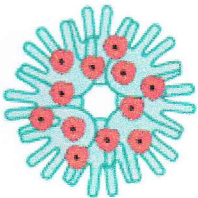
### Step One

With a pencil, trace your hand print 8 to 10 times onto sheets of green construction paper.



### Step Two

Cut out the prints and glue them together like this:



### Step Three

Decorate the wreath with red construction paper poppies or other remembrance pictures.

## Peace Wreath (G,P,SrB,A)

### Materials:

- one 30 cm vine wreath
- white fabric for doves
- six different colours of .5 cm (or slightly narrower) ribbon, each 2 m long
- black embroidery thread or fabric paint
- polyester stuffing
- 12 assorted buttons
- glue gun

For each dove cut two body pieces and four wings.

Draw an eye on your dove with acrylic paint or sew a french knot with embroidery thread. Sew dove using 1 cm seam. Leave opening and insert stuffing. Slip-stitch opening, stitch tail.

Sew wings and insert stuffing. Slip-stitch opening. Sew wings to dove.

Hot glue doves on vine wreath.

Tack ribbons to beaks.

At the top centre of the wreath, tie a bow with the ribbon ends and then attach a button on each ribbon end.

One dove represents each continent as does one colour of ribbon. Use different shapes of buttons, for example, hearts for love and peace, stars to represent the sky, fish to represent the water and trains to represent the land. Use your imagination.
