Safety audits help create safer communities!

Safety audits led by women and girls have resulted in:



The creation of the Toronto Transit Commission's Designated Waiting Areas, Stop Request programs, transparent bus shelters, emergency intercoms and other features to reduce harassment.

The development of the Council of Ontario Universities and Colleges' Campus Safety Audit Guide and related resources, Safer for Women, Safer for Everyone. This advancement in campus safety helped facilitate the improvement of on campus emergency systems to prevent and effectively respond to physical and sexual assaults.



Various community initiatives, supported by the City of Toronto, including:

- The implementation of guidelines on signage, lighting, painting and exit routes in order to reduce violence and the fear of violence in underground garages.
- A community clean-up of unsafe spaces, led by residents, the local councillor and police, with supplies donated by the local Home Depot store and the city.

The promotion of inclusive safety programs, such as "safe space" campaigns, which have been established on numerous campuses to enhance safety for lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, and queer (LGBTQ) staff and students.
